

SUMMARY

Construction documents are intended to **communicate a concept** about the **scope of work for a project**. They're all about communication. We often refer to construction documents as just "plans", but they're more than just a floor plan.

A bundle of construction documents often include:

- plans, specifications, narratives, product data, reports, and sometimes samples or supporting calculations.
- Plans themselves are organized by discipline and feature elements like symbol legends, general notes, details, schedules, one-line and riser diagrams, sections, elevations, and specifications. Other elements include plan notes, callouts, and isometrics to convey three-dimensional aspects.
- Lastly, specifications detail the scope of work, organized by division, section, and parts, covering general requirements, product information, and execution requirements.
