HOW ARE CODES & STANDARDS DEVELOPED?

SUMMARY

Building codes & standards are written and developed by technical committees from code development organizations. Committee membership is usually a volunteer position by members who are nominated and represent a selection of different interest categories.

NFPA Code & Standard Development Process

- NFPA codes & standards are referred to as consensus documents, meaning that the process for development is open, systematic, and reviewed by
 multiple parties who represent different interests.
- Codes and standards are updated on three- to five-year cycles, with a formalized revision process and revision cycle. This includes (1) public input, (2) public comment, (3) NFPA technical meeting, and (4) standards council action.

International Code Council Code Development Process

• The international code council updates their documents every three years, in three stages: (1) code change proposals are submitted, (2) each proposal is reviewed, brought in an open forum in the Committee Action Hearing (CAH), where there is a review process and then a Public Comment Hearing (PCH), and finally (3) eligible voters cast their votes for a consensus vote. The new code edition is published with approved changes.
